

Olympics Bound

Wedmore event rider Jo May and her horse Faere Vision are on their way to next year's Olympic Games following qualification at an event in Germany earlier in the year.

The signs look good for Jo's Olympic hopes as last month she scooped the prize for highest-placed British rider competing at The Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials for the first time. Jo, a qualified instructor who runs her own livery and teaching yard in Wedmore, finished in 25th place and received a miniature of the Land Rover perpetual challenge trophy.

Jo's success is certainly 'home-grown' and is a real family effort. Her father, Peter May, owns 13-year-old Faere Vision. Jo's sister Alison is her groom, and whilst Jo is away competing her other sister, Belinda, attends to the various youngsters and horses that Jo is training for other riders in her stable yard in Stoughton near Wedmore.
